



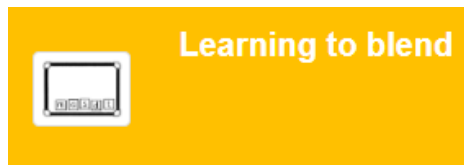

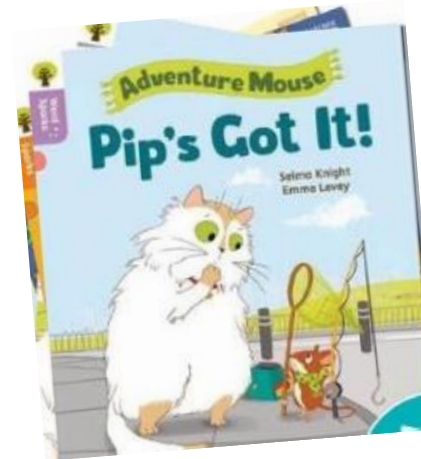

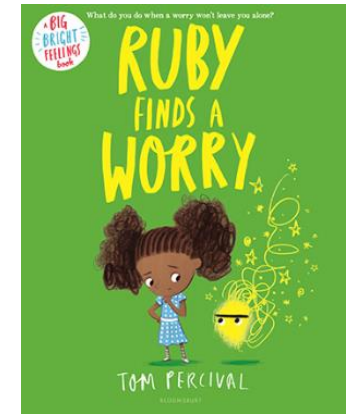

Books Going Home



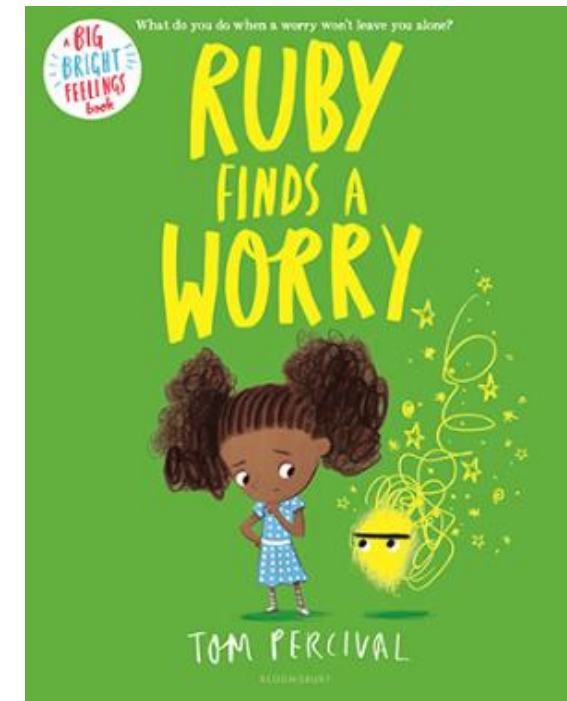
Learn to Read Book
