

<u>Geography</u> Enough for Everyone

We will begin our geography unit revising our understanding of settlements and land use. We will explore the land use in Corfe Mullen and look at how this has changed over time.



We will also discover how energy is produced and debate renewable vs non renewable sources. We will discuss why finding sustainable energy sources is key



for our planet and will look at current UK projects around this theme.

To link in with our DT learning, we will also learn about where different foods are

grown across Europe. We will reflect on our previous learning about climate maps and look at the link between climates and where foods are grown.

In addition to this, we will consider importing of foods and the impact this can have on our over arching theme of the environment. By the end of this unit of work, we will understand the meaning of climate change and global warming. As a class team, we will create an initiative together that will work towards reducing our school's carbon footprint.

DT

We will be learning about where foods come from and why we import some food from

Europe, with a focus on Italian food. We will learn why some people have specific dietary requirements and how menus can be



adapted to suit. Our knowledge will be applied to preparing a staff lunch, following hygiene, dietary requirements and food handling skills. Yum!

Science

In Science, this term, we will be learning about the types of teeth a human has and their purpose. We will consider how



we best care for our teeth and compare the teeth of a herbivore and carnivore. We continue to learn about living things, by looking at food chains, discussing their significance and importance.

Maths

We will continue to focus on securing our times table knowledge. We will begin with learning about fractions, focusing on improper fractions, a whole and mixed numbers. We learn about equivalent and how to simplify a fraction. In measure, we will convert between units of measure and estimate, compare and calculate different measures including money.

<u>RE</u> During our RE unit of work this half term we will be exploring the focus question 'What kind of world did Jesus want?'

We will explore the Christian story 'Calling of the Disciples' and we will think carefully about how Christians believe in the importance of love to all. We will discuss how Christians work hard to make the kind of world Jesus wanted. What actions can we see around us?

Music

During our music sessions this half term we will be creating simple melodies together and discussing the key question 'How does music shape our way of life?'

French

This French unit is titled 'En Classe'. This unit enables us to name many common items that we find in our classroom. It teaches us to say items that we have and don't have when comparing with our friends.

PSHE

This term we focus on the emotional aspects of friendships. We think about the feeling of 'jealousy' and how to handle these feelings. We continue to understand how our friendships change and how to show love to others.
