<u>Geography</u> <u>Map and fieldwork skills</u>

We will begin our geography learning by looking at Ordinance Survey maps, we will look at the different symbols and learn what these mean.



We will locate specific areas on the maps and look at their proximity to us.

History

The focus of our history learning will be based around Corfe Castle. The children will explore a range of resources to learn about the Bankes family and the events around their time at the Castle. We will also focus our learning around the structure of Corfe Castle itself and understand its carefully designed defence features.

We will compare and contrast this to other castles before, in the same time period and beyond.



How can I use texture and colour in a painting to show depth?


We will begin our art learning experimenting with water colour paint application techniques to represent various textures. We will consider the impact of the paper weight and how this affects the paint and our handling of the paintbrush.





We will learn about complementary and harmonious colours and how we can identify them on a colour wheel. We will discuss how other artists, Brianna Mc Carthy and Monet have applied colour to their paintings.

All of our skills and discussion will finally come together when we plan our own landscape painting, considering composition, texture and colour. We will use inspiration form the landscapes we see on our visit to Corfe Castle.



During our science sessions, we will be revising our knowledge of different living things. We will think about the key vocabulary associated with this. (Amphibians, mammals, reptiles, birds and fish) We will also design our own investigations to explore the living things we have in our own school grounds. We will design our own investigations, thinking about the question we want to explore. We will set up and complete these investigations independently.
