

# Henbury View First School Behaviour and Attitudes Curriculum



Intent

'The basis of all human behaviour is kindness.' Eleanor Roosevelt

At Henbury View First School, we develop children's character through our behaviour curriculum. In order to build character, we define the behaviours and habits that we expect students to demonstrate. We want to support our pupils to grow into adults who are polite, respectful, grateful and who always consider others. We believe that as pupils practise these behaviours, over time they become automatic routines that positively shape how they feel about themselves and how other people perceive them.

#### **Implementation**

The curriculum is taught explicitly during the first week in Autumn term alongside the National Curriculum subjects. Children should learn the content of the curriculum so that they can recall the information and act upon it. At the start of each term, the behaviour curriculum is revisited with pupils and will continue to be reinforced throughout the year with a key focus each half term. Teachers will also demonstrate these behaviours and ensure pupils have time to practice these (particularly in the first few days of term). For example, a lining up order should be taught in the classroom but must be reinforced in different locations and times throughout the school day (e.g. at lunchtime). Positive recognition board are visible in all classrooms which celebrate those children showing the 'focus of the day'- it is expected for all children to join the recognition board each day.

#### Adaptions

While this curriculum is for all pupils it will be applied differently in different year groups depending on pupils' ages and may be applied differently depending on individual pupils' SEND needs. Sensitivity must be applied at all times when teaching the curriculum.

### **Belong**

- Use good manners
- Be polite and greet people with good morning or afternoon
- Walking calmly around the school





### **Believe**

- Sit, listen and contribute attentively
- Keep ourselves and others safe by using kind hands, kind feet and kind words
- Show respect to all adults, children and our environment

## Behave

- Understand that my choices have consequences (positive and negative)
- Rewards: stickers, team points, certificates, MarvellousMe, Your Time
- Responsibility ladder (chance, choice, consequence)

Extra Support: Some children find it difficult to regulate their behaviour. When this is the case, they may have a behaviour plan with smaller stepped rewards and consequences. However, no-one is allowed to behave in a way that breaks our rules of kindness, being safe and being respectful.
