



Our Learning.

In Year 4 this half term, we have loved learning about Europe and are really excited about our upcoming Europe Day! So far, we have looked at continents of the world, focused on Europe and the capital cities and explored some key features of continents. We are also really enjoying our new class novel — Rumaysa: A Fairytale. We like to spot the similarities and differences in fairytales that we already know and discuss what's new.





Year 3 has been a hive of activity so far this year. The children have settled extremely well into new routines and are producing some AMAZING learning which we are so proud of them for!

In History, we have been exploring life in prehistoric Britain. We have followed life from the Stone Age, through the Bronze Age and into the Iron Age. We have discovered how daily life changed between these periods, focusing on different types of houses and settlement.

During our science learning, we have investigated how our skeletons work! We have looked closely at why we need a skeleton and how some animals have different types of skeleton. We have also named bones using scientific names and investigated how joints and muscles work.

The children have really enjoyed being introduced to the French language this half term! They have fully immersed themselves in talking in French to each other- greeting each other, introducing themselves, asking (and answering) how each other are and saying goodbye. We have been particularly impressed with how well the children have begun to write in French too- writing down the French conversational phrases and sentences that they have learned.

In Year 2 this week, we had a visit from the fire service. The fire fighters showed us the inside of the fire engine and explained how to be 'fire safe '. They even let us use the fire hose and try on their equipment and uniforms! We all had a marvellous time learning about fire safety and fire engines. We learnt the invaluable lesson of STOP, DROP and ROLL, it is a simple fire safety technique.





This half term in year 1, we've embarked on a creative journey that has involved exploring shapes, experimenting with colour mixing, and the art of block colours and collage. Inspired by Henri Matisse's 'The Snail,' our young artists have been hard at work crafting their own abstract animals. Can you decipher the captivating creatures they've brought to life?

This half term in Foundation we have been settling into our classroom and learning school routines. We have enjoyed sharing stories like 'Not now Bernard' and 'We're going on a bear hunt' as well as starting our number journey with the help of the Numberblocks. We have talked about how special our family are to us and have enjoyed sharing pictures and stories about our loved ones.
